

Anna-Beth's Stick-to-your-ribs Pocket Scarf

This super-simple scarf includes neat little pockets for keeping hands warm. When I'm making them for Warm for Winter, I like to include a snack and a note of encouragement in mine. It is a perfect project for knitting while you watch TV or chat with friends. – Anna-Beth

You'll Need:

About 200 Yards of Worsted Weight yarn – Example made with one skein of Lion Brand Homespun
Size 9 Knitting needles
Yarn Needle

Directions:

Cast on 26 stitches, leaving a tail of at least 18 inches.
All Rows: K1, P1 till you have about 2 yards of yarn left in your skein, or until scarf reaches about 9" longer than desired length. (See, it's just endless rib stitch – hence the cutesy title!)

Bind off.

Fold ends of scarf up by about 4 inches on either end for pockets.

Use tail of cast on plus left-over yarn to sew up pocket sides.
