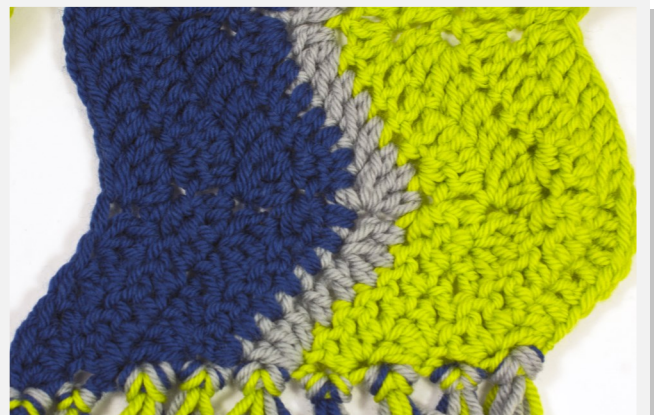


220 Superwash®
Spirit Wave Scarf

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Size

Approximately 87" length x 5.25" width

Materials

Cascade Yarns 220 Superwash®,
100 % Superwash Wool
(100 g / 3.5 oz – 220 yds / 201 m)
1 skein each of color numbers 885,
892, and 887

Crochet hook, size H/8 (5mm) or size needed
to obtain gauge

Yarn Needle

Skill Level:

Easy

Blocked Gauge

In pattern, 13 dc and 7 rows = 4"

Special Stitches

Double Crochet 3 Together (dc3tog) – yo, insert hook into first indicated stitch, yo and pull up a loop – 3 loops on hook, yo and draw through 2 loops, yo, insert hook into second indicated stitch, yo and pull up a loop – 4 loops on hook, yo and draw through 2 loops – 3 loops left on hook, yo, insert hook into third indicated stitch, yo and pull up a loop – 5 loops on hook, yo and draw through 2 loops – 4 loops left on hook, yo and draw through all four loops to complete stitch.

Stitch Abbreviations

ch – chain stitch

dc – double crochet

dc3tog – double crochet 3 together

st - stitch

sts - stitches

yo – yarn over

Customize It!

The ripple stitch pattern used is a multiple of 14 stitches plus two for starting turning chain, so if you are getting gauge, approximately one set of the stitch repeat is equal to 4 inches. Knowing that, you can adjust the length of your scarf quite easily. Width is also easily changed – it all depends on how many rows you stitch with each color. I encourage you to make a gauge swatch of 3 to 4 stitch repeats, so you can customize the color usage in pattern to fit the width you desire.

Scarf

Ch 240

Row 1: 2 dc in 3rd ch from hook (ch 2 counts as part of 1st dc), * 1 dc in each of next 3 ch, [over next 3 ch – dc3tog] twice, 1 dc in each of next 3 ch, [3 dc into next ch] twice, repeat from *, ending last repeat with 3 dc into the last ch. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as 1st dc here and throughout pattern), 2 dc into first st, * 1 dc in each of next 3 sts, [over next 3 sts – dc3tog] twice, 1 dc in each of next 3 sts, [3 dc into next st] twice, repeat from *, ending last repeat with 3 dc into top of turning ch. Turn.

Repeat Row 2 until scarf is desired width.

Fasten off, block flat to measurements, and then weave in all ends.

Scarf Pattern as Pictured

To match the color pattern I used, please do the following:

Rows 1-4 – Main Color A (887 – Wasabi)

Row 5 – Accent Color (892 – Space Needle)

Rows 6-9 – Main Color B (885 – In The Navy)
